

Ride Share Services

Once you arrive at the airport, you will need to make arrangements for ground transportation to the hotel. The airport is approximately 13 miles from the various hotels. Plan ahead by reviewing the options below for transportation between the airport and the hotel.

Pick-up app-based rideshare rides in the middle of the 3rd floor parking garage in the marked stall numbers 1-34 in the orange and purple sections of the garage.

- **Lyft:** Cost estimate is \$42-\$75 one-way
- **Uber:** Cost estimate is \$50-\$75 one-way
- Taxi: Cost estimate is \$48.
 - There is a \$40 flat rate for passengers going to SeaTac airport from downtown hotels. There is no flat rate leaving the airport and you will be charged the meter rate.

Airport Shuttle

Premier Airport Shuttle provides shared and private door-to-door van service from \$33 per person to downtown Seattle hotels. Shuttles are available at the Ground Transportation Plaza on the third floor in the airport parking garage. Check-in at the Premier Airport Shuttle kiosk. Public Transit

Seattle is easy to navigate with a wide variety of smart transportation options. For more detailed information, go to <u>visitseattle.org/visitor-information/getting-around</u>.

Link Light Rail:

Sound Transit's Link Light Rail makes trips from downtown Seattle and SEA Airport. Trains arrive every 8 to 15 minutes, depending on the time of day, and take about 40 minutes to travel between Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (SEA) and Westlake Station in downtown Seattle.

Seattle Center Monorail:

The iconic Seattle Center Monorail travels between Westlake Center in downtown and the Seattle Center at the base of Queen Anne hill. This is the easiest way to get to the Seattle Space Needle, Museum of Pop Culture, and more at the Seattle Center. Trains depart every 10 minutes and the trip takes only 2 minutes each way.

Seattle Street Cars:

This line connects the South Lake Union neighborhood to Seattle's vibrant downtown core consisting of 1.3 miles, nine stops, and full of shops and restaurants as well as Lake Union's 12-acre waterfront park.

Bike and Scooter Sharing:

Seattle is a bike and scooter-friendly city. If you're visiting, it's easy to find a ride no matter where you are. Open your Uber app and select the '2-Wheels' option from the top menu to quickly and easily reserve a nearby **Lime** bike or scooter for \$1, plus varying rates per minute. All rentals are dockless and include an electric assist that provides a boost up to 15mph. Or try **VEO**'s Cosmo-e bike, suitable for a range of physical abilities and preferences. The Cosmo-e provides users with the option of pedaling or using the throttle to get where they need to go.

Electric scooters also dot the streets of Seattle, adding an alternative way to move through the city. Keep an eye out for options from <u>Bird</u>, <u>LINK</u>, <u>WHEELS</u>, and <u>SPIN</u> to enjoy this unique app-based mode of transportation.

SAFETY TIPS

Seattle is one of the nation's safest big cities, statistically, but like in all cities, visitors are advised to observe some basic safety procedures, adhere to local laws, and report crime to appropriate officials.

- Remove your conference badge; don't draw attention to yourself and the fact that you're a tourist.
- Walk in well-lit areas; Use main streets and avoid shortcuts through alleys.
- Safety in numbers: Stay in groups when exploring the city.
- Be aware of your surroundings. Keep your eyes up and not on your phone.
- Keep the address and phone number of where you're staying in your phone in case you find yourself turned around.
- Do not carry large amounts of cash. Use debit/credit cards.
- Pay attention to your instincts; if something doesn't feel right, you can always walk into a business/hotel for help.
- Keep hotel room numbers private. Keep track of room keys. If a key is lost, ask for a different room, or ask for the locks to be changed.
- Use all locks on hotel door, particularly the double lock. Always lock the door when leaving.
- When returning to your room, make sure that you have your room key out and ready.
- Never automatically open your door when a knock is heard. Know your visitor's identity prior to
 admittance. Use your peephole, if available, or talk through the locked door. If someone claims they
 are from maintenance, security or a hotel employee, phone the front desk to make sure the visitor is
 legitimate

The Metropolitan Improvement District (MID) provides Community Safety & Hospitality ambassadors on the ground in six downtown neighborhoods to assist visitors, residents, workers, and those in need. Ambassadors are on the streets of downtown seven days a week, 362 days a year from 7:00 AM – 9:00 PM ensuring clean, safe, and welcoming experience for everyone. From providing directions to out-of-towners to connecting those in need with services, this dedicated team helps keep downtown safe, vibrant and welcoming. Look for the blue and green jackets on bicycles for assistance. If provided with at least 30 minutes advanced notice, MID can escort you to your destination. Safety & Security Tips and Tools for Visitors

Seattle is one of the nation's safest big cities, statistically, but like in all cities, visitors are advised to observe some basic safety procedures, adhere to local laws and report crime to appropriate officials.

Common Sense Safety Tips

When out and about

- Remove your conference badge; don't draw attention to yourself and the fact that you're a tourist.
- Safety in numbers: Grab a friend or colleague while exploring the city.
- Walk in well-lit areas; Use main streets and avoid shortcuts through alleys.
- If alone after dark, use a ride service such as Lyft, Uber or a cab.
- Be conscious of your belongings. Keep personal/valuable items in your hotel safe or close at hand.
- Keep the address and phone number of where you're staying in your phone in case you find yourself turned around.
- Be aware of your surroundings. Keep your eyes up and not on your phone.
- Pay attention to your instincts; if something doesn't feel right, you can always walk into a business/hotel for help.
- If you are in a drinking establishment, don't leave your drink unattended.
- Walk with purpose and project an assertive and business-like image. Criminals will be discouraged if you do not appear vulnerable or easily intimidated.



- Do not carry large amounts of cash. Use traveler's checks or debit/credit cards.
 Keep a record of traveler's checks numbers, credit card numbers, photocopy of passport and other valuable documents separate from originals.
- Be careful and alert when cashing traveler's checks, or using a cash machine. Never let someone see how much money you have in your wallet, or where you keep your money.
- Don't wear expensive jewelry and watches when out sightseeing. If you must wear it, wear it inside your clothing.
- Pickpockets are often attracted to crowded places. They often work in teams of two or three; one may create a distraction while the other one lifts your wallet. Be aware of someone who bumps, shoves or gets too close.
- Learn to carry your purse or wallet safely.
 Purses should be closed, held in front of your body, with your arm across it. Wallets should be carried in a front pants pocket or in an interior jacket pocket.

Common Sense Safety Tips

At your hotel


- Prior to arriving, book hotel reservations using only first and middle initial and last name, particularly women traveling alone.
- Keep your currency and credit cards in multiple places. Keep some cash and an extra credit card in a safe place in your belongings or in a room safe. This way if for some reason you become separated from it, you aren't stranded.
- Keep room numbers private. Don't sign bar or restaurant checks with your room number.
 Keep track of room keys. If a key is lost, ask for a different room, or ask for the locks to be changed.
- Use all locks on hotel door, particularly the double lock. Always lock the door when leaving.
- When returning to your room, make sure that you have your room key out and ready.
- Never automatically open your door when a knock is heard. Know your visitor's identity prior to admittance. Use your peephole, if available, or talk through the locked door. If someone claims they are from maintenance, security or a hotel employee, phone the front desk to make sure the visitor is legitimate.
- Put valuables in a signed and sealed envelope and leave it in the room safe.
- Be alert for suspicious persons in the hotel hallways. Report them to the manager.
- Locate fire exits, elevators and the nearest phone. Plan the best way to get out of the building in an emergency.
- Label all pieces of luggage with your name, address, and phone number, both inside and outside. For the outside label be sure to use a tag that closes, so the information can't be read by a passerby.

Panhandlers

Aggressive panhandling is illegal in Seattle. If someone obstructs or intimidates you and aggressively begs for money, you do not have to give them money, and you can report this offense to the police department.

Please do not encourage or reward panhandling.

From time to time you will see vendors on street corners selling a newspaper called Real Change, a publication written by low-income and homeless people. New issues come out every Wednesday morning. Purchasing a copy supports those in need. Donations can also be made at realchangenews.org

Washington State's Recreational Marijuana Laws

The law states it is illegal to smoke or open a package containing marijuana or a marijuana product, such as edibles, in public. "Public" includes, but is not limited to, parks, museums, sidewalks, businesses, residential areas, federal and public lands and waterways.

The possession of marijuana is a federal offense. This means that marijuana purchased in Washington State must be consumed within the state's boundaries. It is illegal to take it across state borders or into another country.

Smoking marijuana in bars or restaurants is also illegal. Washington State prohibits smoking of any kind in all indoor places.
